



Dear Law Enforcement Professional,

Recently, I learned of a company named ID Me 911. The mission of the company is to assist Law Enforcement in the safe return of missing persons. ID Me 911 recently launched their App specifically built for Law Enforcement. The App serves multiple functions. Please allow me just a couple minutes to briefly explain them.

When called to investigate a missing person, Law Enforcement will be able to send missing person notifications to other Law Enforcement Professionals in and around their jurisdiction, much like an Amber Alert but without the restrictions or time delays. These notifications contain the missing person's name, photograph, physical description, possible destination, and other important information.

Additionally, ID Me 911 has created a secure and comprehensive database allowing families and caretakers to register their loved ones. Once complete, the individual's profile page can be printed to include a photograph. The profile page contains all information necessary for Law Enforcement to initiate a missing person investigation. The sooner Law Enforcement has this information, the sooner they can begin looking for the missing person.

Law Enforcement will have access to the database when they encounter someone who has a difficult time communicating with them due to a developmental or intellectual disability. Limited information can then be utilized to initiate a search of the database. If the individual has been registered in the database, the Law Enforcement Professional will have access to their full profile page which contains emergency contact information, address, immediate medical concerns, and other information important to their safe return home.

If the individual is not registered in the database, a Law Enforcement Professional can create a "Do you know me" notification. This will be sent in the same manner as the missing person notification with the hope a Law Enforcement Professional within the agency or in an agency within a surrounding jurisdiction will recognize the individual and allow for a safe and prompt return home.

The ID Me 911 App is available only to Law Enforcement to maintain the safety and security of those registered in the database. The website, however, is available to anyone wishing to register their loved ones, free of charge.

Your agency will not have the capability to send missing person notifications or access the database unless you belong to the network. I encourage you to visit their website, [www.IDMe911.com](http://www.IDMe911.com), to learn how you can join the ID Me 911 network today.
